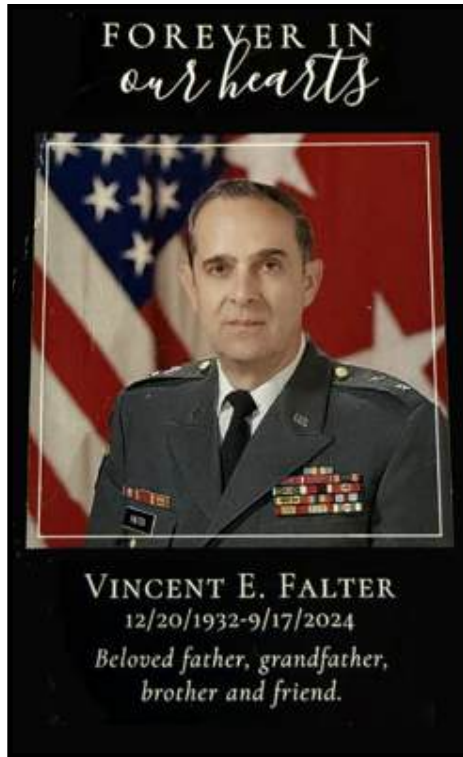
Memorial Day

A visit to Arlington National Cemetery is always a deeply meaningful experience for me. The seemingly endless rows of simple headstones conveys a sense of pain and loss along with a powerful sense of unity and strength of purpose. We have visited every national cemetery in Europe and like visiting Arlington, while walking row after row of brave veterans who gave their all to their nation makes one feel the weight of the world on their shoulders.

My husband and I visited Arlington on March 28th, 2025, for a very special reason—a fellow American and veteran was laid to rest. MG Vince Falter was more than a fellow American, though. He was a Vietnam veteran, a mentor and father figure to my husband. MG Falter entered our lives when he interviewed and selected my husband to be his Aide de Camp in 1980 in Augsburg, Germany. While Glen was his aide, the General was promoted to the rank of Major General and Glen was promoted (by the General) to the rank of Captain. For those in the 'old' army, you will remember the shoulder boards that were made with real gold bullion threads. The General gifted his Captains dress blue boards to Glen and, of course, promoted him in his dress blues. Glen held on to those shoulder boards for awhile and passed them on to the son of a fellow officer (armor) whose son was promoted to Captain in the Field Artillery (the branch of both the



General and my husband). When Glen was selected for promotion to Colonel, I requested he ask the now retired General to promote him, as that made the ceremony special for all of us.

We remained good friends over the years, even after the General lost his lovely wife. We shared Christmas cards, news about our two children and his, a son and a daughter. We would always stop to see him in VA when we traveled through and he loved to take us to his favorite luncheonette.

After the Arlington service, guests were asked to pay their respects to the family. As I paid my respects to his grown son, he looked at me with wonder in his eyes (who is she?) I said "Augsburg, the duty train to Berlin, the Commander in Chief salon car" (I knew that would trigger a memory) and Vince Jr. started to cry. You see, we kept in touch with Laura who lived next door to the General, but Vince Jr. was always traveling the world and we didn't see him. When Vince Jr. realized that someone who had worked for his dad in 1980, in Germany, came to pay his respects to his father he was moved to tears. The General passed at 91 and not many of his contemporaries were still around!

Arlington National Cemetery is a place where visitors can connect with the legacy of the United States armed forces throughout our

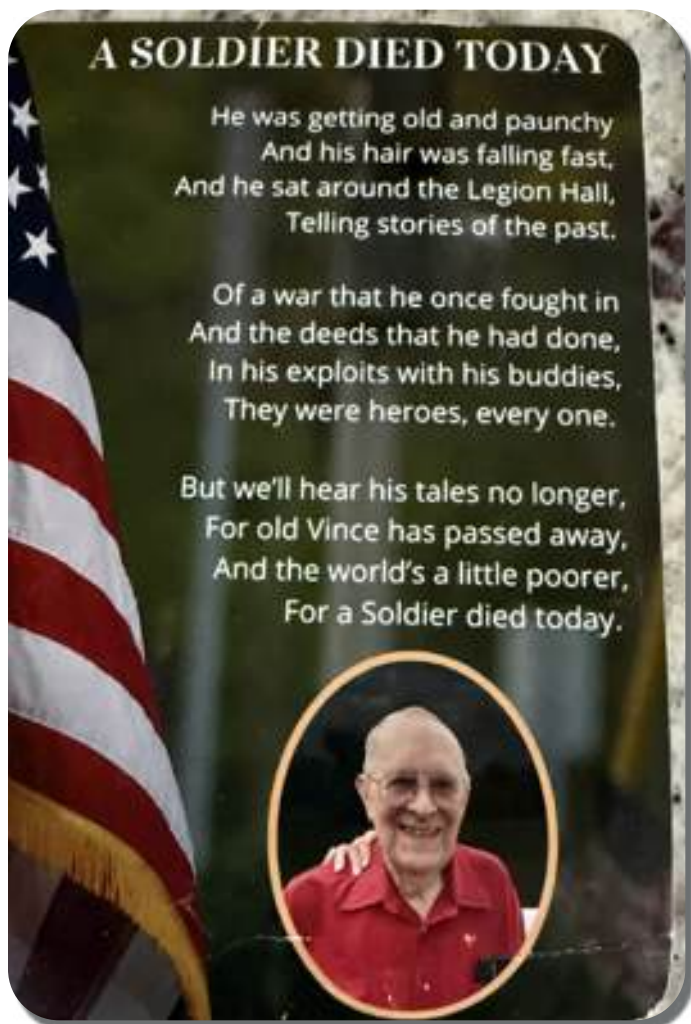

Memorial Day

A Day to Remember the Fallen



On May 26th we celebrate Memorial Day. Memorial Day is a reminder of the brave men and women who served our country and gave their lives for our freedom.

It's not just a day off; it's a time to think about why we remember these heroes. For veterans, it's a chance to honor those who are no longer here.

Bills Headed to the Governor



SB2 - Education Savings Plan/ School Choice - *Signed by the Governor on 5/3/25*

SB17 - Has to do with foreign entities being able to purchase land in Texas. *Passed by the House on 5/9/25.*

SB305 - Making it a criminal offense to pass certain vehicles on a highway

- Emergency vehicles with emergency lights on
- Stationary Tow Trucks using heavy equipment
- Texas Department of Transportation vehicles doing highway maintenance or construction-utility vehicles using signals
- Trash or garbage trucks/recycle trucks
- Toll project vehicles with signals
- Animal Control vehicles picking up animals
- Parking meter ticketers

Sent to the Governor on 5/8/25.

SB1862 - Has to do with canceling driver's licenses when you move from one state to the next, so that someone does not vote twice. *Passed the Senate, in Committee in the House.*

SB1999 - Protects teachers from 'gender bias'. It protects them from being fired or removed if they do not use certain pronouns.

HB1393 - Daylight Savings – to keep more daylight in the day and not change back. *Out of Committee in the Senate.*

Water Bills are finally being Considered

Why we need water legislation:

- 1400-1600 people a day move to Texas
- Texas is 25 years behind in water supply equipment
- Somewhere in the 2040-2050 range, we will have communities out of water if we do not address this now.
- Fresh water level is almost depleted. Now, we go after the brackish water (hard).
- There is a Water Treaty of 1944 with Mexico that is not being honored; however, they do not have any water either.
- Desalinization is being pursued in order to move water over the next 50 years.

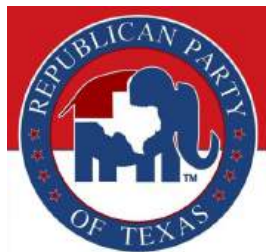

Important Dates for the 89th Texas Legislative Session

- Jan. 14 First day of the Regular Session
 - Feb. 2 Governor's State of the State address, where legislative priorities will be announced. These bills can be passed immediately.
 - Feb. 13 Committees can begin considering legislation.
 - Mar. 14 All bills can be voted on after this date.
 - Mar. 15 First day all non-emergency bills are eligible to be voted on.
 - May 12 Last day for House committees to report House bill and joint resolutions.
 - May 15 Last day for the House to consider second reading House bills and joint resolutions on the daily or supplemental calendar.
 - May 16 Last day for the House to consider consent House bills and all third reading House bills and joint resolutions on the calendar.
 - May 23 Last day for House committees to report Senate bills and joint resolutions.
 - May 27 Last day for the House to consider second reading Senate bills and joint resolutions on the calendar.
 - May 28 Last day for the House to consider local and consent Senate bills and all third reading Senate bills and joint resolutions.
 - June 2 Final day of the session (Sine Die)
- AFTER THE SESSION**
- June 22 Last day for the Governor to sign or veto bills passed during the session.
 - Sept. 1 Most new laws go into effect unless specified otherwise.

Election Integrity in Action



When I worked as an Election Judge in New Mexico, my fellow Republicans expressed fear that the process was unfair. When offered the chance to work elections, however, they all

declined. Although all are concerned about Election Integrity, few are willing to invest the time and effort to assure that our own elections are fairly and competently run.

We require voter photo I.D. in Texas to be able to vote, but if the person checking in the voter does not care enough to actually look at the photo on the I.D., then what good is the requirement of voter photo I.D.? The laws we pass are all for naught if we do not have our best working elections.

Each polling place is run by an Election Judge. In Comal County, all but one of the Election Judges are Republican. In even numbered years, the Republican County Chair submits the names of Election Judges for the Commissioners Court to approve for a two-year term. Election Judges choose their own clerks. The Election Judge runs the polling place. It is his or her responsibility to make sure nothing inappropriate happens in the polling place.

Are you interested in making sure that we have the best people possible working elections? Would you be willing to invest the time it takes to make that happen? Stop by Comal County Republican Headquarters, 256 Landa Street in New Braunfels and let the County Chair know of your interest.

Election Results Political Activities Report



Please click [here](#) to see the elections results for Comal County. Note that the color code next to a candidate's name does not denote whether someone is running as a Republican, Democrat, or another party. The color codes for this election are computer generated.

The Comal ISD District 7 race had the highest voter turnout with a total of 1,458 votes. David Krawczynski was the winner with 1,073 votes. The city of New Braunfels Council member, District 1, had three candidates with a total of 818 votes. Toni L. Carter was the winner with 419 votes. Comal County Municipal Utility District (MUD) N0.5, Simmons Valley MUD, and Canyon Ranch MUD all passed.

In San Antonio, the run-off candidates for mayor are Gina Ortiz-Jones and Rolando Pablos. The Bexar County Republican Party Headquarters is requesting urgent assistance with phone bank support in opposition to Gina Ortiz-Jones. If you are interested in assisting, Carolyn Besselman is organizing a carpool. The headquarters has everything necessary already set-up – they just need assistance with calling. We highly recommend viewing the ALL IN Podcast on [You Tube with Ben Shapiro and Antonio Gracias – “DOGE updates + Liberation Day Tariff Reactions.”](#) Antonio Gracias details his time as a member of DOGE, investigating the Social Security Administration. In 2024, the number of Social Security Numbers issued to non-U.S. citizens spiked at 2,095,247. That number in 2022 was 590,193 and in 2023 was 964,163. This is a legitimate program that was abused by the Biden Administration with the result that non-citizens with no viable reason to be in our country have SSNs and are ELIGIBLE and receiving aid such as MEDICAID.



Candidate Development Program

The **Candidate Development Program** is available for any TFRW member around Texas who would like to either run for office, or to help those who are running for office. The application is NOW live, [HERE](#). Preference is given to those who would like to personally run within the next couple of years. The program will run on eight consecutive Thursday evenings from July 10 to August 28, 7 to 9 p.m. (CDT) each week. The sessions are only one hour long, and are discussion based with a little homework. The cost is only \$75 and the money pays for your luncheon at the first quarter board meeting in January 2026. Graduates will be recognized, and their certificates of class completion will be handed out at the program. The application process is fairly easy - and all online - with the **applications being due by May 18th**, and a decision will be made by June 15th. The **class will start on July 10th**.
