## Sine Die - Key Wins in the 89th Legislative Session

### **Senate Bill 1, SB 4, SB 23, Senate Joint Resolution 2, SJR 85**

- ◆ Eliminate school property taxes for the average senior homeowner, with a \$200,000 senior homestead exemption and dedicating nearly 1 out of every 4 state dollars in our budget toward property tax relief. (\$140,000 homestead exemption for homeowners under age 65);
- ◆ Provide significant business personal property tax relief

### **SB 2**

- ◆ Launching the largest school choice program in American history;
- ◆ Provides the largest teacher pay raise in Texas history

**SB 9, SB 40, SJR 5** - Bail Reform to keep dangerous criminals behind bars

**SB 3059** - Protect the Alamo

**SB 3070** - End the corrupt Texas Lottery Commission and moves the lottery to the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR)

Rename the Gulf of Mexico to the 'Gulf of America'

Rename the New York Strip steak as the 'Texas Strip'

## The Saudi Prince

### Political Activities Report

During President Trump's visit to Saudi Arabia, he used his remarks to offer an optimistic outlook about the future of the Middle East. He announced he would be open to easing sanctions on Syria at the urging of allies, saying, "we want to give them a fresh start" following the fall of Bashar Assad's regime and years of civil war.

President Trump also agreed to say hello to the new Syrian President Ahmed al-Sharaa signaling an openness to the new government.

He also stated, "It is crucial for the wider world to note the transformation in the Middle East has not come from Western interventionists flying in with lectures on how to live or how to govern your own affairs." He also declared that the so-called "nation builders" wrecked far more nations than they built.

### Investments forum outcome

President Trump secured a \$600 billion commitment from Saudi Arabia to invest in the U.S., which the crown prince first announced days after the inauguration. The deal struck Tuesday includes a \$142 billion defense and security deal that equips Saudi Arabia with state-of-the-art war equipment provided by dozens of U.S. firms.

As part of the deal, Saudi Arabian company DataVolt is moving forward with plans to invest \$20 billion in artificial intelligence data centers and energy infrastructure in the U.S., and top

companies including Google, Oracle, Salesforce and Uber are investing \$80 billion in technologies in both countries.



Also included in the deal are infrastructure projects American companies Hill International, Jacobs, Parsons, and AECOM are taking on in Saudi Arabia, including at King Salman International Airport, to total \$2 billion in U.S. service exports.

Other sector-specific funds will be created through the investment partnership, including a \$5 billion energy investment fund, \$5 billion New Era Aerospace and Defense

Technology Fund and \$4 billion Enfield Sports Global Sports Fund.

President Trump's first call to a foreign leader after his swearing-in was to Crown Prince Salman, who also has a personal relationship with Trump's son-in-law and former senior adviser, Jared Kushner.

But the crown prince has faced major controversy for his human rights record. U.S. lawmakers have been particularly outspoken about the case of Jamal Khashoggi, a Saudi dissident and a columnist for The Washington Post who was killed inside the Saudi Consulate in Istanbul in 2018.

### Who is Mohammed bin Salman Al Saud?

He is the *de facto* ruler of the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, formally serving as Crown Prince and Prime Minister. He is the heir apparent to the Saudi throne, the seventh son of King Salman of Saudi Arabia, and the grandson of the nation's founder, Ibn Saud.

Mohammed is the first child of King Salman bin Abdulaziz and his third wife. After obtaining a law degree from King Saud University, he became an advisor to his father in 2009. He was appointed deputy crown prince and defense minister after his father became king in 2015, then promoted to crown prince in 2017. Mohammed succeeded his father as prime minister in 2022.

Since his appointment as crown prince in 2017, Mohammed has introduced a series of social and economic reforms; these include curtailing the influence of the Wahhabi religious establishment by restricting the powers of the religious police and improving women's rights, removing the ban on female drivers in 2018, and weakening the male-guardianship system in 2019. However, he also continues to repress women's rights activists. His Saudi Vision 2030 program aims to reduce the Saudi economy's reliance on oil through investment in other sectors such as technology and tourism. Despite these attempts at greater economic diversification, the Saudi economy remains heavily reliant on oil.

Mohammed leads an authoritarian government. Those regarded as political dissidents are systematically repressed through methods including imprisonment and torture; citizens face arrest for social media posts that mildly criticize government policies. Between 2017 and 2019, he led the purge of competing Saudi political and economic elites, alleging that they were involved in corruption and seizing up to US \$800 billion in assets and cash and cementing control over Saudi

politics.

Jeanne Slupik presented the information in this article at the CLRW May Business Meeting to highlight not only President Trump's significant accomplishments specifically with Saudi Arabia, but to also provide insight into the power of Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman Al Saud. Having spent a significant amount of time in the region, Jeanne's goal is to educate, to give you the facts. The Crown Prince has made strides to "open" his country; but make no mistake, he is an authoritarian ruler. 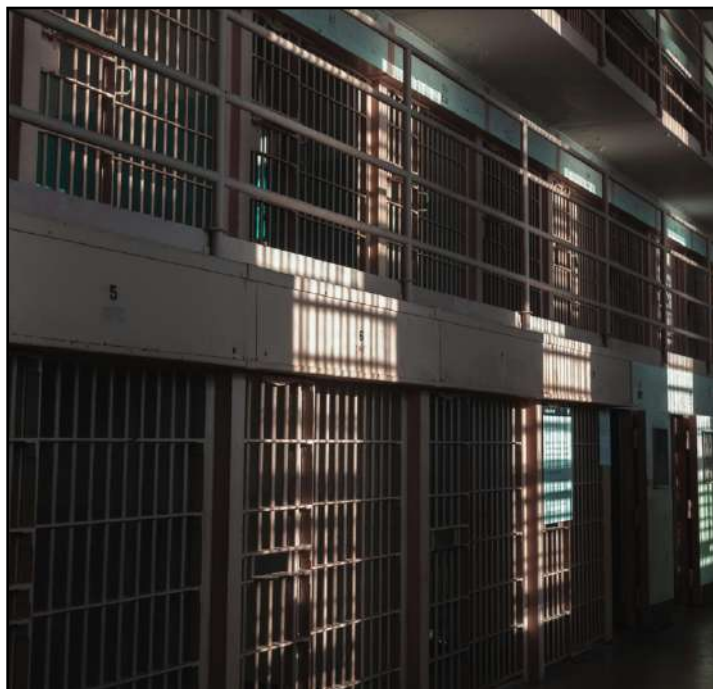

## Alcatraz

*What do you know about Alcatraz? Or what do you not know about Alcatraz?*

1. It was originally a military Fort 1850-1933
2. Military prisoners built the prison structure after the US Army left and families lived on the island
3. The island had the first lighthouse on the Pacific coast built in 1852
4. Named Alcatraz in 1775 by Spanish explorer Juan Manuel de Ayala meaning Island of Pelicans
5. Native American activists occupied the island for 2 years to protest for Indian self-determination
6. The island is a 22-acre speck of land in San Francisco Bay
7. Nicknamed "THE ROCK" because it was a harsh and formidable prison



### How many of these facts did you know?

Now the prison may be "Trumpized" with President Trump wanting it to be used to house the most violent federal criminals.

The plan of the Trump Administration is to reopen five previously closed prisons with Alcatraz having the highest profile.

On May 5, 2025, officials visited the prison to see what would be involved in restoring the prison to house criminals.

The prison has been closed for more than 60 years. It has endured deteriorating infrastructure, particularly the effects of the saltwater environment.

Water temperature is 50-55 degrees with strong currents. Despite the temperature and currents, 36 men attempted to escape 14 separate times during the years Alcatraz was open. Nearly all were captured or drowned in the frigid waters surrounding THE ROCK. Maximum of 336 prisoners could be held in the old structure, but average population was 260-275.

The Bureau of Prisons Director, William Marshall told Lara Trump on her new FOX News Show "We absolutely think we can get it done." It will cost 10's of millions to 100's of millions to restore the prison. We will see what happens in the near future. President Trump believes Alcatraz will serve as a symbol of LAW, ORDER AND JUSTICE.

## Let's pause to celebrate National Flag Day on Saturday, June 14, 2025!

Though not a federal holiday, Flag Day is an annual observance for all Americans. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. After the adoption of The Declaration of Independence, Congress felt it necessary to adopt the American flag. Prior to this time, each colony or individual special interest had its own flag. The resolution stated: "The flag of the United States shall be thirteen stripes, alternate red and white, with a union of thirteen stars of white on a blue field ..." An official announcement of the new flag was not made until Sept. 3, 1777.

"Flag Day" has been celebrated as a patriotic occasion for several decades, but it was President Woodrow Wilson who made the observance official on May 30, 1916, by a presidential proclamation.

### Who Made the First American Flag?

The origins of the Stars and Stripes have become part of American folklore. Although many people believe Betsy Ross designed and sewed the first flag, there is no complete proof of this. Records do indicate, however, that Betsy Ross most definitely made ensigns and pennants for the Philadelphia Navy during the war, and she certainly inspired the design of the current flag.

The Following Facts We Do Know to Be True:

- ◆ The original 1777 flag was designed to represent the 13 original colonies. It had 13 white stars on a blue field and 13 alternating red and white stripes.
- ◆ One of the first flag designs had the stars arranged in a circle, based on the concept that all colonies were equal.
- ◆ In 1818, after a few design changes, the United States Congress decided to retain the flag's original 13 stripes and add new stars to reflect each new state that entered the Union.
- ◆ When a new state was added to the Union, a new star was added. Today, there are 50 stars, one for each state in the Union, but the 13 stripes remain.



### Did You Know This Interesting Fact?

The current American flag was designed by a high school student from Lancaster, Ohio named Bob G. Heft! Even though Bob's history teacher gave him a "B-" for not knowing how many states the Union had, Bob submitted his design to the White House (unprompted) in anticipation of Hawaii and Alaska joining the Union. To Bob's surprise, President Eisenhower called him! Today, it's Bob Heft's 1958 design—which shows 50 stars in a field that included five rows of six stars and four rows of five stars—which is now our 50-star American flag. (Bob's history teacher changed his grade to an "A"!). The new 50-star flag was flown for the first time on July 4, 1960 – that flag still flies today.

Take time this **Flag Day, June 14th**, to celebrate and proudly fly "**Old Glory**"! Show your American spirit and patriotism. **God Bless America!**

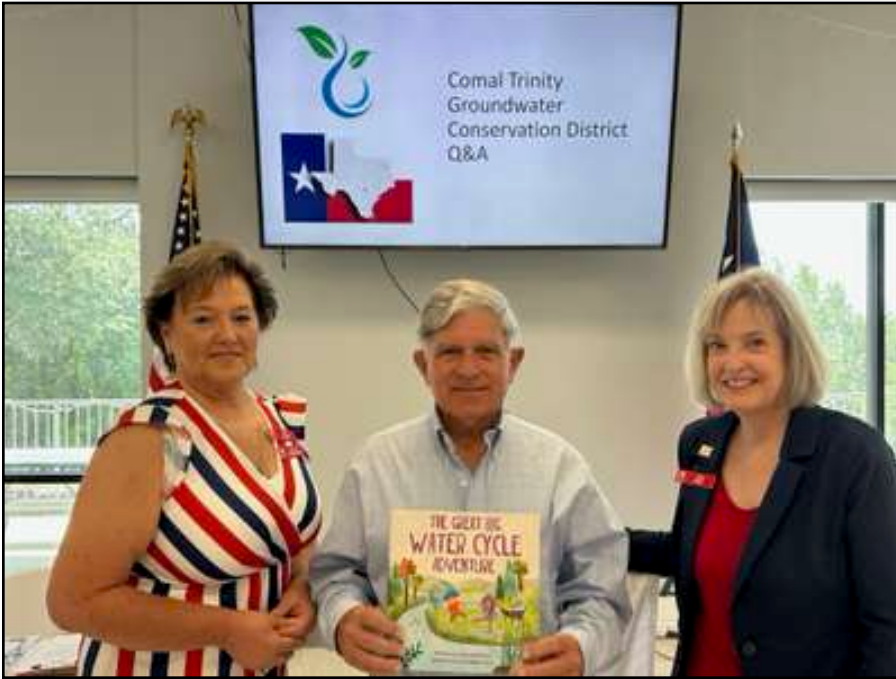

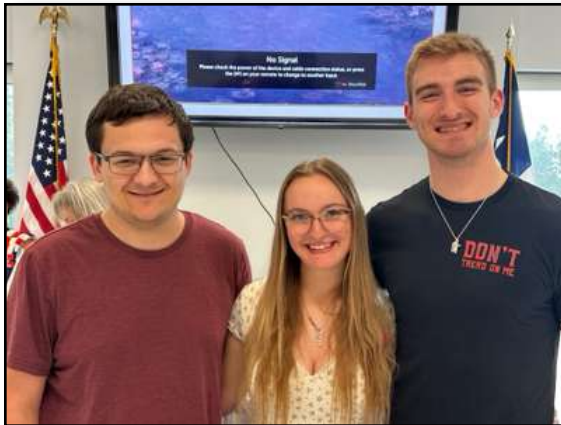
